## SECTION 4: First-aid measures

### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

First-aid measures after inhalation : IF INHALED: Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. Call a POISON CENTER or doctor/physician if you feel unwell.

### 5.2. Specific hazards arising from the chemical

### Potential health effects

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- Mutagenicity** : Pyrethrins were not found to be genotoxic and did not damage DNA in any study conducted which included: Ames assay, chromosome aberration in Chinese hamster ovaries (CHO) cells and in the unscheduled DNA synthesis (UDS) assay in cultured human liver cells, Piperonyl butoxide was not mutagenic in a battery of tests, Butoxypolypropylene glycol is not a mutagen.
- Carcinogenicity** : Pyrethrins are not listed as a carcinogen by OSHA, IARC, or NTP, Piperonyl butoxide is not classified as carcinogen by NTP, IARC and OSHA, Butoxypolypropylene glycol is not listed as a carcinogen by OSHA, IARC or NTP.
